PRINCIPAL'S LETTER

On behalf of the BCA Community, and at the sad passing of H.M. Queen Elizabeth II, I would like to express my deepest respect and appreciation for her years of service to Britain, the Commonwealth, and the wider world of nations.

Students and staff have made a strong and positive start to the new school year. I am very pleased that within the very first week we were able to host all of the Meet the Teaching Team events, and provide parents with a detailed outline of the plans for teaching and learning, for the whole year ahead (previously issued termly). Welcome to all new students and their families, and also to the new teachers and assistants who have joined BCA, further strengthening the team and the educational opportunities we provide.

Uploaded to the Parent Portal (please see the notices below for how to access it) are the results of the 'Climate for Learning' 2022 parent survey we conducted before the summer holidays, in June 2022. It was the first such extensive survey the school has conducted. The survey was open for three weeks with the invitation to complete sent out three times. The results of the survey are very useful for the school's development, and the results have already informed actions. The survey also invited written responses to open-ended questions: these were provided and received in confidence and reviewed carefully by the school leadership team. You will see that about 70 parents completed the survey, and we are grateful for their time and thought. The survey will become an annual one, to enable longer term tracking, and we hope for a higher response rate, ideally over 75%, in 2023.

Alongside our daily work of ensuring high quality learning and wellbeing for every child at the school, BCA will focus on two key areas of strategy this year:

I. Assessment

2. Communication

And in addition we must ensure:

- 3. A successful outcome to our first **IGCSE examinations** (Year 11) i.e. smooth administration and every child achieving their best.
- 4. Successful **authorisation for the International Baccalaureate (IB)** Diploma Programme (Years 12 & 13)- next term we host an inspection visit for this process.

Alongside the above headline items, there are all kinds of exciting things happening in the areas of **Outdoor Learning**, **Music**, **Language provision**, **PSHE**, **Counseling**, **Clubs**, **Sport and PE** (with a specialist PE teacher now working with Year 3 upwards).

On Assessment, things are already moving quickly. Teachers have developed a new **Feedback Policy** that reflects current best practice in placing emphasis on 'in the moment' immediate and in-person feedback from teacher to student, along with peer feedback at times, too. Traditional 'marking' of students' work will still take place, but time must be set aside for students to closely study, and act upon, what the teacher has written. In the next few weeks we will administer a standardised **Cognitive Assessment Test (**'CAT4') for all students from Year 3 to 11 inclusive. This test, widely used in the UK and in international schools, measures verbal, non-verbal, quantitative and spatial reasoning. The total time needed for the test is about 2 hours, and no preparation is required. This will be very helpful as an externally-referenced 'baseline' measure to inform teaching, learning and target setting. Parents receive a copy of the report.

The cost charged to parents for this additional service will be approximately 20 Euro. Driven by our move to the IBDP, we will be developing a new **Assessment Policy**, which among many other things will recognise that authentic assessment means much more than 'tests'.

On Communication, Early Years and Primary parents will already see that we have extended the functions of **Seesaw** as our platform for daily communication of learning between school and home, involving the students, their teachers and their parents. **Our iSAMS Parent Portal**, previously only used for publishing the school reports, is steadily being loaded up with the key documents you need, throughout the year, to stay informed about your child's learning along with school policies and procedures. **Meet the Teacher** events have already been held for all classes, across the school, and the first **Parent Conferences** have been scheduled (see notices below).

As we move forward into the new school year, let us all, students, staff and parents, set the highest expectations on ourselves in pursuing educational success.
