





# HEAD, HEART AND HANDS



The learning stories and images in this newsletter exemplify the diversity of experiences and opportunities that our students enjoy each day.

Our Mission statement speaks to the importance of educating the whole child. The idea of a 'holistic' education has deep and historic roots. One of my 'influencers' is the Swiss social reformer Johann Heinrich Pestalozzi (1746-1827). He is known as the Father of Modern Education because he was the first to see teaching as a subject worth studying in its own right, what we now know as 'pedagogy'.

Pestalozzi said that education should develop the powers of 'Head', 'Heart' and 'Hands'. He believed that this would help create individuals who are capable of knowing what is right and what is wrong and of acting according to this knowledge.

The news stories below from the IGCSE examinations, a fascinating talk about mineral resources by a parent, and the chess competition, are obvious examples of the 'Head' in action, but equally our recent Sports Days were as much a mental game as a physical one. The 'Heart' must permeate all activities at school ('where happy children learn best'): students must know the learning intentions and what the success criteria look like, if they are to be motivated and enjoy having their own agency.

BCA students act daily from their Heart, witness the spontaneous bake sale organised by children from Peacocks this week, and the smiles on the children's faces during exciting field trips (there is something happening almost every day right now!) that they will remember for many years to come. The 'Hands' are also employed because we try to make activities authentic and 'hands-on', for example the pictures below from the Year 2 Forest Art and the Year 4 Pop Art workshop.





Next week, although only a short one, is our Biodiversity Week. We have many environmental activities planned. Cygnets have got off to a head-start already, building lovely homes for minibeasts! Our green campus is looking at its best right now: flowers everywhere, trees resplendent, birds singing. What better place to engage "head, heart and hands"?
