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#### JANE GOODALL CONFERENCE

Last month, 30 BCA student ambassadors visited Ágora school to watch a conversation with legendary primatologist Jane Goodall. During the talk, Dr. Goodall shared some engaging stories about how she first became involved in observing chimpanzees. She also explained and even demonstrated some of the behaviours she observed - the first person ever to observe such behaviours - such as the use of sticks to eat termites. Previously, the use of tools was believed to be a uniquely human trait, yet Dr Goodall showed that this complexity extends to the animal kingdom as well. The talk was a fascinating insight not only into our closest animal relatives, but also into the 'indomitable human spirit' which motivated Dr Goodall to dedicate her life to learning about and seeking to protect the flora and fauna of our world. Here are her own inspiring words which everyone should heed and take inspiration from:

"So I think hopefully by the end of this evening people will understand that each one of us has a role to play; each one of us can make a difference and the difference that we make will impact the future of children. Our grandchildren. The future generations. And also the biodiversity on which we depend. The animals and the plants that are part of this amazing planet on which we have the privilege of being alive today, and I think that the role that we can play today is the most important that any generation before us has had to play. Because we are at a critical point. If we don't get together and take action now, it may be too late".
