We are pleased to announce that we have implemented the whole school House System at BCA. The House coordinator is our Secondary teacher, Ms Curteis, who has explained to families the purpose and the activities that will take place all over the year.

The House system is common in British schools. As you know by now, it is a way of arranging children into groups of mixed-age for certain activities.

The Houses of Harry Potter's fictional school Hogwarts have been used as a well-known example, but the similarity is only superficial. In Hogwarts, the House system is run by the adults, with points awarded at the teacher's whim, and Houses quickly gain a certain reputation e.g. goodies or baddies, athletic or academic. It's a bit of fun and goes no deeper.

The BCA House system will encompass and strengthen key aspects of the student experience, including:

The idea of these forums is to engage with educational themes of current interest, and particularly those around which there may be a range of opinions. The idea is to provide parents with information, to hear their views, and the views of educators and specialists, and to clarify and/or shape school policy.

Relationships Education is taught in Primary, and Relationships and Sex Education is taught in Secondary, always in an age-appropriate manner and in line with the English National Curriculum. Parents are informed in advance of when sex education is to be covered and, as in the UK, have the right to withdraw their child from certain areas of the RSE curriculum.

Early pick-ups in the afternoon

Collecting your child early for medical appointments is of course absolutely fine.

We have noticed an increase in requests to collect children early for other reasons. This can be disruptive for the children and teachers, who may be in the middle of a lesson. It requires additional coordination by our administration team. Full time attendance at school is required for all children in Year 2 above.

We will continue to assist with these requests, but kindly ask parents, if an early pick up in the afternoon is necessary, to do this at break time or lesson change over times i.e.

Primary: before 13:50, or between 14:50 and 15:10 Secondary: before 14:30, or at 15:30

After 15:10/15:30, please wait until the end of the school day (16:15/16:30) to collect your child.
