These are not the topics of a university researcher but the titles of the IB Extended Essays recently completed by our Year 13 students, who will form the first graduating cohort in Spring 2025. The Essay is a well known and, by universities, highly valued part of the Diploma Programme. Students <u>develop their own question</u>, following their interests, and complete academic research and produce a <u>4000 word paper</u>. I am very proud of our students and the staff who have supported them. Our Year 13 students have multiple work priorities right now, are beginning university applications, and are responding very well to all the challenges.



You will see from the activities reported in this newsletter that we continue to take many opportunities to enhance the student learning experience with local visits and engagement with the **culture of Andorra and beyond:** Nursery at Caldea, Year 2 in the forest, a visit by Andorran Olympian Nahuel Carabaña to Year 6, Secondary on an expedition to the Sorteny valley, and Secondary again on a geography trip to Sitges.
